PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Mentoring Format:

- One in-person session per month.
- Monthly mentor check-ins tailored to each mentee's needs (via phone, school visits, or outside school).

Parental Expectations:

- Review the calendar of events and arrange drop-offs at the designated pick-up location.
- Notify us at least 48 hours in advance if ride accommodations are needed.

Mentee Engagement:

- Encourage your mentee to participate actively and try new experiences.
- Activities are designed to foster personal growth, teamwork, and confidence.

Dress Code:

- Proper attire is required for every event.
- Dress code details will be included in event invitations.

Cost:

 All events and activities are provided free of charge to mentees, ensuring accessibility for all participants.

PROGRAM BENEFITS

Each mentee will receive the following items as part of their participation:

MICRO-SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Bro. Gary James Pages With Purpose Micro-Scholarship

- Purpose: This scholarship encourages a love of reading and recognizes mentees for their achievements in the annual reading competition.
- Rules & Requirements:
 - Testing & Book Requests:
 - Mentees can only take tests and request books at monthly in-person sessions.
 - It is the mentee's responsibility to request their test and order their next book during these sessions.
 - Mentees are responsible for tracking their progress and ensuring all tests and book requests are completed in a timely manner.
 - The deadline for submissions is October 31, 2025.
- Award Timing: The winner will be announced in November 2025.
- Prize: Up to \$250 annually, with the potential to earn up to \$1,750 by winning every year in the program.

Kendale Thomas Service Excellence Micro-Scholarship

- Purpose: This scholarship honors mentees who demonstrate outstanding commitment to community service.
- Rules & Requirements:
 - Mentees must log and submit their community service hours using this link: <u>Volunteer Hours Submission Form</u>.
 - All hours must be submitted no later than October 31, 2025.
 - It is the responsibility of each mentee to ensure hours are submitted on time.
- Award Timing: The winner will be announced in November 2025.
- Prize: Recognition and a scholarship for exemplary service contributions.
